# Introduction

I started this book by creating small toys that are simple to make and a good size for little hands. It's always nice to find a way to use your stash and what's more, with these patterns you can make something cute in just a few hours. But as I proceeded I decided that I also wanted to include projects of different sizes and styles. I would like many people to enjoy this book and so I tried to create something for everyone: at the beginning of the book there are very simple knits that use very basic knitting techniques, we then move on to patterns that are a little more involved and then, towards the end of the book, there are much larger projects with different components and characters.

You may want to make these toys for a child or as a gift for a friend. I design toys mainly to please myself as my boys are too grown up to play with them now, although I do know that they are tickled by some of my more quirky designs! Knitting toys is fantastic because you get to have lots of fun during the creation process and you also get to make someone happy when you present them with your unique handmade gift. This is what I am aiming for with this book – to make you knitters happy.

You can be fairly relaxed with knitting the pieces here. You do not need to follow each pattern diligently: if you miss a stitch in one row, you can add a stitch in the next. If you decide you want to improvise the pattern, feel free! Use the colour of your choice and go wild with your imagination.

In order to make up the toys you will need to assemble them, sew them and embroider them. You may find these processes a little fiddly at first, but please don't be put off – I can assure you that the end result will be worth it. And one final thing – please bear in mind that some of the toys may be too small to give to a very young child – always refer to the finished size and cautions written on the page before you start to knit.

I do hope you enjoy this book.

# Materials and tools

## Yarn

All the toys in this book are knitted with DK (8-ply) yarn, and you don't need much to create each toy; some require less than 5g (1/6oz), which is equivalent to a skein of tapestry wool. The largest project is the castle (see pages 100–107) and it requires about 60g (2oz). You may already have oddments of yarn left over from previous projects and these toys are the perfect way to use up your stash. I prefer knitting with DK (8-ply) yarn, which is why I've used it throughout the book, but you can use any weight of yarn you like – simply adjust the needle size accordingly.



I have mainly used 100 per cent wool yarns in the projects, as I love the feel of wool and the colour tones it can create. If you are making toys for children you might wish to choose natural materials. I also find wool is the easiest when you want to make stitches neat and even. Feel free to experiment with alpaca, mohair, cotton or synthetic yarns for different texture. I have also used chunky fleecy yarn for some projects. This can be replaced with mohair or bouclé yarn if you prefer. If you only need a small amount of certain colours, tapestry yarn may be a good choice.

## Stuffing

I mostly use washed wool fleece to stuff my knitted toys. It's ideal as it is natural, has plenty of bounce, fills any shapes well and is inexpensive. If you cannot get hold of wool fleece, you can use polyester toy filling of course, which is readily available from craft shops.







## Needles

### **A pair of double-pointed needles size 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2)**

This is the needle size I used for all the toys in the book. Your knitting tension (gauge) needs to be fairly tight, so that when the toys are sewn up the stuffing is not visible through the stitches. If you struggle with knitting DK (8-ply) yarn on fine needles, experiment with a larger size. Some knitters naturally knit tighter than others and the tension (gauge) will also differ depending on the yarn you use. I have given a general tension (gauge) as a guide on page 14, but I haven't specified tensions (gauges) for any of the projects in this book, as the size of the finished projects doesn't really matter.

### **Crochet hook, size 3.0mm (UK 11, US C/2 or D/3) or similar**

Some of the projects require you to use a crochet hook for a few simple processes: making chains and picking up stitches from a knitted piece. You don't need to know how to create any crochet stitches for this book.

### **Sharp needle**

I recommend that you use a chenille or tapestry needle with a sharp point, as it will be easier to work through your tightly knitted toys than a blunt-ended needle. You can also use the same needle for embroidering. Your toys will be sewn up using the same yarn that you knitted them with, ideally using yarn ends, if you have left them. It is a good idea to make a habit of leaving fairly long ends when you cast on and fasten off.



## Other tools

### **Wooden chopstick**

A simple but incredibly effective tool, a chopstick is by far the best instrument for pushing stuffing into your toys, as you can use it to reach into slender body parts. If you don't have one, you could use a large knitting needle or a pencil.

### **Scissors**

Essential for trimming yarn ends when sewing up.





# Basic knitting

The stitches used in this book are just very basic knit and purl. It still amazes me that it is possible to turn small amounts of yarn into something really special using just these two simple techniques. All the toys are knitted flat with two double-pointed knitting needles.

## Increasing and decreasing

To increase one stitch, knit or purl into the front loop and the back loop of the same stitch. This will not create a hole, unlike picking up between the stitches or bringing the yarn forward. To decrease one stitch, knit or purl two stitches together.

## Yarn ends

Always leave long ends when casting on and fastening off, for sewing up the piece later. Tuck any unsewn yarn ends inside the body of the toy before you sew it up; not only can you reduce waste in this way, but the colour will match and so the stuffing will be less visible.

## Tension (gauge)

This is only a rough guide and it is not essential to follow it, as long as you keep your own tension consistent throughout. I work to a tension of 12 sts and 16 rows over a 4cm (1½in) square, in st/st, using 2.75mm (UK 12, US 2) knitting needles.

## Basic crochet

I have used only a couple of simple crochet techniques throughout: making chains and slip stitch.

### Tip

*Stretch or rest your hands from time to time if you are not used to knitting tight pieces with small needles. Open and close your hands to exercise them and to prevent them becoming stiff or sore.*




# Abbreviations

## Crochet

ch	chain

# Sewing up and stuffing

Not all of the human figures in the book are the same size. Snow White is 8cm (3¼in) tall (see page 108), while others, such as the cavemen, are only 4cm (1½in) tall (see page 96). However, the basic method for making all the figures is the same: you will sew and shape the body, stuff, flatten the base and create facial features in the same way. Make sure you read through these instructions before you start, so that you are familiar with the process. I have used an overcast stitch throughout.



## Creating the head, body and skirt



Here are the head, body, arms and sleeves needed for Snow White (see page 108).



**1** Using the skin colour fasten-off yarn end, start at the top of the head and start to sew the seam using overcast stitch.



**2** Stop when you reach the end of the skin colour head section.



**3** Use the blue fasten-off yarn end to continue to sew the seam down to the back of the body. Finish stitching when you reach the end of the blue section.



**4** Starting now at the base of the piece, use the yellow cast-on yarn end to work a gathering thread along the bottom.



**5** Pull the thread tight to draw in your stitches.



**6** Complete the base by sewing outwards from the centre of the circle to the edge, joining the two open edges, as shown.



**7** Roll a small ball of stuffing and push it into the head, using a chopstick or needle. This will help you to avoid creating a thick neck.



**8** Continue to stuff the body, a small amount at a time, until it feels firm. Leave out one yarn end of each colour, and tuck all the others inside. Sew the rest of the back seam.



**9** Work a gathering stitch all the way around the neck, at the row indicated in the pattern.



**10** Pull the yarn tight to draw in the neck. Take the yarn up to the eye line.



**11** Work a gathering stitch along the eyeline. Pull the yarn tight to create the shape of the face.



**12** Take the yarn to nose height, and backstitch three times on the same spot to create a nose.



**13** Take the yellow yarn end, and pass it through the body and out through the centre of the base. Then, take it back through the base and bring it out at Snow White's back.



**14** Pull the yarn firmly to dent the base of the body. This will help Snow White to stand upright.



**15** To complete the base, take the yarn back out through the centre again and cut the end.



**16** To create Snow White's waist, run a gathering stitch around the lowest line of blue stitches, and pull firmly to draw it in. Fasten off the yarn end.

## Creating the sleeves and arms



**1** Weave the red yarn ends into the piece to secure them, then trim them off.



**2** Wrap a sleeve piece around one of the arms, and using the blue cast-on end, secure in place with a couple of stitches.




**3** Use the blue cast-on yarn end to sew the underarm seam of the sleeve. Hide the skin colour yarn inside the arm, and the fasten-off end of the blue yarn inside the sleeve; trim the ends. Leave the remaining blue yarn end for now.



**4** Repeat for the other arm. Using the remaining blue yarn end, sew each arm in place, with the seam facing down. Fasten off.

## Creating the hair, eyes and bow



**1** Wrap a length of fine brown fingering (2-ply) yarn around your fingers, twenty-five to thirty times to create a loop.




**2** Position this centrally on top of Snow White's head, to ensure that you are happy with the length.



**3** Using a length of matching yarn, sew the hair in place along a central parting using backstitch.



**4** Secure the hair at the sides of the head with a few stitches, to create the style. Secure the yarn and trim the ends.



**5** Use dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn to make a French knot for each eye, taking the needle point out through a strand of yarn on the face, not between the stitches; after creating the first eye, take the yarn through the head to create the second, then take it out of the back of the head to fasten off.



**6** Take a length of red yarn through Snow White's head, and sew a long stitch over the top to create a hair band. Bring the yarn out at the top centre of her head.




**7** Take the yarn over the hair band and through the head, creating a loop – do not pull this tight. Instead, leaving it loose, backstitch at the base to secure it. Repeat a second time to create the second loop of the bow. Secure the yarn and fasten off.



# Key techniques

## Creating knitted eyes

Most of the characters' eyes are simply French knots, but some, such as those for the panda, are made in the following way:



**1** Cast on the number of stitches given in your pattern. Thread the yarn end on to a sewing needle.



**2** Transfer your stitches on to the sewing needle: pass the sewing needle right the way through all your stitches.



**3** Push the sewing needle in through the same end of the stitches and take it out from the outer edge. Pull tight to connect the ends.



**4** You should now have created a half-circle shape. Put the sewing needle through the centre of the shape and bring it out at the outer edge.




**5** Repeat step 4 to create a circle.




## Creating an i-cord

I-cords are used for many things within the book, from the tail of a mouse to Snow White's arms, so this is a great skill to learn.




**1** Cast on the required number of stitches according to your pattern, using double-pointed needles.



**2** Do not turn the needle, instead, slide the stitches to the other end. Bring the working yarn behind the stitches.



**3** Knit one row of stitches.



**4** Continue to knit the stitches until the i-cord reaches the correct length for your pattern.



**5** Carefully transfer your stitches on to a sewing needle.



**6** Take the needle through the last row of stitches a second time.



**7** Finish by weaving the yarn tails inside the i-cord, and trim the ends.



# Basic embroidery

Some simple embroidery stitches are used to complete the toys. I most commonly use fingering (4-ply) yarn or DK (8-ply) yarn to embroider faces.


## French knots

These are used for most of the toys' eyes. Take the needle through the yarn, separating the fibres, instead of taking the needle out between the stitches. This prevents the eye from sinking into the face.


For the human figures, and for toys where I want the eyes to stand out, I have used a full strand of DK (8-ply) yarn, not just two strands.



**1** Bring the thread through where the knot is required, at A. Holding the thread between your thumb and finger, wrap it around the needle twice.



**2** Hold the thread firmly with your thumb and turn the needle back to A. Insert it as close to A as possible, at B, and pull the thread through to form a knot.



**3** Make a small stitch on the wrong side of the fabric before fastening off.




## Backstitch


This simple stitch is used to create mouth and nose markings on many of the toys, and colourful back markings on a few others, such as the chameleon (pages 32–33).




**1** Bring the needle up at A and pull the thread through. Insert the needle at B and bring it through at C. Pull the thread through the fabric.



**2** Insert the needle at D and bring it up at E. Pull the thread through.




**3** Insert the needle at F and bring it up at G. Continue working along the stitch line until it is completed. To finish off, thread your needle through the stitches on the wrong side of your work.






## Chain stitch

This is used to create the pattern on the basketball (see page 40).



**1** Bring the needle up through the fabric at A and pull the thread through. Insert the needle at B, as close as possible to A, and bring it up at C. Keep the thread under the needle. Pull the thread through gently to form the first chain.



**2** Insert the needle at D, as close as possible to C, and bring the needle up at E. Keeping the thread under the needle, pull the thread through gently to form the second chain.



**3** Continue in this way, making evenly sized chain stitches, until the line of stitching is complete.


# Have fun!

# The toys





# Teddy buddies

## Instructions

The legs, body and head for both bears are all knitted in one piece.

## Small teddy

### Right leg

Cast on 10 sts with brown and light brown mix yarn and st/st 6 rows, starting with a k row.

Break yarn, keep stitches on a spare needle or a stitch holder.

### Left leg

Follow the instructions given for the right leg, but do not break off the yarn. With right side facing, place the right leg on the left side of the left leg on the same needle and continue.

Row 7: k5, yf, sl1, yb, turn, sl1, p to end.

Row 8: k across all sts to connect the two legs (20).

Row 9: p5, yb, sl1, yf, turn, sl1, k to end.

Row 10: p (20).

Row 11: k14, yf, sl1, yb, turn, sl1, p8, yb, sl1, yf, turn, sl1, k to end.

Rows 12–15: st/st.

Row 16: (p2tog) to end (10).

Row 17: k.

Row 18: pf/b in each st (20).

Rows 19–26: st/st.

Row 27: (k2tog) to end (10).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Arms: make two

Cast on 6 sts with brown and light brown mix yarn and st/st 6 rows, starting with a k row. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Ears: make two

Cast on 8 sts with brown and light brown mix yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Muzzle

Cast on 12 sts with beige yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Scarf

Cast on 3 sts with dark red yarn and work an i-cord (see page 21) for 10cm (4in).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Sew the head and body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff, avoiding the neck area and close the seam. Work a gathering thread around the neck, pull tightly and fasten off. Sew each leg seam, leaving the cast-on edges unsewn for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Attach the muzzle and ears. Using black DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot. Take two strands from the black DK (8-ply) yarn and embroider the nose and mouth with short backstitches. Sew in the ends of the scarf neatly and tie the scarf around the neck.

## Materials

### Small teddy:

DK (8-ply) yarn: 7g (¼oz),  
brown and light brown mix

*Note: For both bears I have used a brown and light brown tweed yarn. Use any colour yarn in your stash.*

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts  
of beige, dark red and black

Stuffing

### Big teddy:

DK (8-ply) yarn: 10g (⅓oz),  
brown and light brown mix

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts  
of beige, dark red and black

Stuffing

## Size

Small teddy: 7.5cm (3in) tall

Big teddy: 9cm (3½in) tall

## Additional equipment

A spare needle or stitch holder

## Difficulty level

Beginner

# Big teddy

## Right leg

Cast on 15 sts with brown and light brown mix yarn and st/st 9 rows, starting with p row.

Break yarn, keep stitches on a spare needle or a stitch holder.

## Left leg

Follow the instructions given for the right leg, but do not break off the yarn. With right side facing, place the right leg on the left side of the left leg on the same needle and continue.

Row 10: k7, yf, sl1, yb, turn, sl1, p to end.

Row 11: k across all sts to connect the two legs (30).

Row 12: p7, yb, sl1, yf, turn, sl1, k to end.

Row 13: p.

Row 14: k21, yf, sl1, yb, turn, sl1, p15, yb, sl1, yf, turn, k to end.

Rows 15–21: st/st.

Row 22: (k2tog) to end (15).

Row 23: p.

Row 24: kf/b in each st (30).

Rows 25–34: st/st.

Row 35: (p2tog) to end (15).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Arms: make two

Cast on 8 sts with brown and light brown mix yarn and st/st 9 rows, starting with a k row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Ears: make two

Cast on 10 sts with brown and light brown mix yarn and p 1 row. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Muzzle

Cast on 14 sts with beige yarn and p 1 row. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Scarf

Cast on 4 sts with dark red yarn and work an i-cord for 12cm (4¾in). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## To make up

Make up as for the small teddy.



# Cosy snowmen

## Instructions

### Body and head

Cast on 10 sts with white yarn.  
Row 1: p.  
Row 2: kf/b in each st (20).  
Rows 3–11: st/st.  
Row 12 (shape neck): (k2tog) to end (10).  
Row 13: p.  
Row 14: (kf/b) to end (20).  
Rows 15–23: st/st.  
Row 24: (k2tog) to end (10).  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Hat

Cast on 22 sts with multi-coloured yarn.  
Rows 1–8: st/st, starting with a k row.  
Row 9: k1, (k2tog, k1) to end (15).  
Rows 10–12: st/st.  
Row 13: (k2tog) to last st, k1 (8).  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Scarf

Cast on 3 sts with multi-coloured yarn and work an i-cord for 10cm (4in). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Sew the body seam, leaving a gap at the base. Roll the stuffing into two small balls and stuff the head and body, avoiding the neck area. With the cast-on end of yarn, work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge and sew up the rest of the base seam. Work a gathering thread around the neck at row 12, draw up tightly and fasten off.

Sew the seam of the hat and attach it to the head.

Using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and each eyebrow with a backstitch (see page 22).

### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: 5g (1/6oz), white

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amount of multi-coloured

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of dark brown and pink or two strands taken from dark brown and pink DK (8-ply) yarn

Stuffing

### Size

6cm (2¼in) tall

### Difficulty level

Beginner

Embroider the nose and mouth with a French knot, using pink fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from pink DK (8-ply) yarn. Sew in the ends of the scarf and tie the scarf around the neck.





# Awesome aeroplanes

## Instructions

### Main body

Starting with the tail, cast on 6 sts with blue yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (12).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (18).

Row 5: p.

Row 6: (k2, kf/b) to end (24).

Rows 7–16: st/st.

Rows 17–18: change to light blue yarn and st/st.

Row 19: (p2, p2tog) to end (18).

Rows 20–22: st/st.

Row 23: (p2, p2tog) to last 2 sts, p2 (14).

Rows 24–26: st/st.

Row 27: (p2tog) to end (7).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Wings: make two

Cast on 8 sts with light blue yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 5: skpo, k to end (7).

Row 6: p to last 2 sts, p2tog (6).

Row 7: skpo, k to end (5).

Row 8: k for fold line. (This is the front edge.)

Row 9: kf/b, k to end (6).

Row 10: p to last st, pf/b (7).

Row 11: kf/b, k to end (8).

Rows 12–15: st/st.

Cast off.

### Tail wings: make three

With light blue yarn cast on 8 sts.

Rows 1–2: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 3: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (6).

Row 4: p.

Row 5: as row 3 (4).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Propeller

Cast on 12 sts with aqua blue yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 5: p for fold line.

Rows 6–9: st/st, starting with a p row.

Cast off.

### Centre of the propeller

Cast on 6 sts with red yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Materials

### Blue aeroplane:

DK (8-ply) yarn: 4g (1/8oz)  
each of blue and light blue

DK (8-ply) yarn: small  
amounts of aqua blue  
and red

Stuffing

### Size

7cm (2¾in) long

### Difficulty level

Beginner

## To make up

Sew the body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Fold each wing piece, each tail wing piece and the propeller in half with right sides out and sew the seams without stuffing. Attach them to the body, using the picture for guidance. Sew the red centre of the propeller in place at the front of the aeroplane.





# Colourful chameleons

## Instructions

### Body and tail

Starting at the tail, cast on 3 sts with green or khaki yellow yarn.

Rows 1–20: work an i-cord.

Work in st/st from this point on.

Row 21: cast on 1 st, p2, pf/b (5).

Row 22: kf/b, k3, kf/b (7).

Row 23: pf/b, p to last st, pf/b (9).

Row 24: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (11).

Row 25: as row 23 (13).

Row 26: as row 24 (15).

Row 27: as row 23 (17).

Row 28: k.

Row 29: p.

Row 30: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (19).

Rows 31–35: st/st.

Row 36: (k2, k2tog) to last 3 sts, k3 (15).

Rows 37–39: st/st.

Cast off.

### Head

Cast on 30 sts with green or khaki yellow yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 5: k13, (k2tog) twice, k13 (28).

Row 6: p10, (p2tog) four times, p10 (24).

Row 7: k11, k2tog, k11 (23).

Rows 8–10: st/st.

Row 11: (k2, k2tog) to last 3 sts, k3 (18).

Row 12: p.

Row 13: (k1, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Eyes: make two

Cast on 10 sts with green or khaki yellow yarn and p 1 row. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Tummy

Cast on 7 sts with light green yarn.

Rows 1–12: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 13: skpo, k3, k2tog (5).

Rows 14–16: st/st.

Row 17: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).

Rows 18–20: st/st.

Row 21: k1, k2tog (2).

Row 22: p2tog and fasten off.

### Front legs: make two

Cast on 4 sts with green or khaki yellow yarn and work an i-cord for 5 rows.

Row 6: k2, then work an i-cord for one more row on these 2 sts only, using another needle.

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

Rejoin yarn to the remaining 2 sts and work an i-cord for two rows on these 2 sts only.

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

### Back legs: make two

Follow the instructions given for the front legs, except work an i-cord for 6 rows instead of 5 rows at the start.

### To make up

Sew the tummy and the top of the body together, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam.

### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn:  
10g (1/3oz), green or khaki yellow

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of light green for the tummy, brown for the mouth and yellow or green for the stripes

Stuffing

### Size

11cm (4¼in) long, including the tail

### Difficulty level

Intermediate

To create the bump on the top of the head, pinch together about 1cm (½in) of the cast-on edge on the top of the head and sew the seam. Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the head seam. Leave the cast-on end open. Stuff the head. Attach the cast-on edge of the head to the body. Attach the front and back legs.

Attach the eyes to the head, using the picture for guidance. Using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the centre of each eye with a French knot. Embroider the mouth with brown DK (8-ply) yarn and backstitch. Embroider the stripes with yellow or green DK (8-ply) yarn and backstitch. Coil the tail and secure it with a few stitches to shape.



# Little Red Riding Hood & the wolf

## Instructions

### Little Red Riding Hood

#### Body and head

Cast on 6 sts with red yarn.  
Row 1: p.  
Row 2: kf/b in each st (12).  
Row 3: p.  
Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (18).  
Row 5: k for fold line.  
Rows 6–13: st/st, starting with a k row.  
Row 14: (k1, k2tog) to end (12).  
Change to skin colour yarn.  
Row 15: p.  
Row 16: k4, (kf/b) four times, k4 (16).  
Rows 17–19: st/st.  
Row 20: k3, (k2tog, k1) three times, k4 (13).  
Rows 21–22: st/st.  
Row 23: p1, (p2tog, p1) to end (9).  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Hood

Cast on 20 sts with red yarn.  
Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a k row.  
Row 5: (k2tog) to end (10).  
Row 6: p.  
Row 7: kf/b to end (20).  
Rows 8–14: st/st.  
Cast off.

#### To make up

Sew up the body and head and flatten the base, following the instructions on pages 16–18. Work a gathering thread around the eye line. Using golden brown DK (8-ply) yarn, make loops for the hair with backstitch, leaving a loop every other stitch. Embroider each eye with a French knot and brown DK (8-ply) yarn. Create a nose by backstitching the same spot three times using skin colour DK (8-ply) yarn. Fold the hood in half across the cast-off edge and sew the cast-off edge together to form the top of the hood. Place the hood on the head and secure with a few stitches.

### Wolf

#### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 6 sts with grey yarn.  
Row 1: p.  
Row 2: kf/b in each st (12).  
Row 3: p.  
Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (18).  
Join in white yarn.  
Row 5: p4 white, p10 grey, p4 white.  
Rows 6–15: keeping the colours correct, st/st.  
Row 16: (k1, k2tog, k1) white, k2 grey, (k2tog, k2) twice in grey, (k1, k2tog, k1) white (14).  
Row 17: cast on 4 sts in white, keeping the colours correct, p to end (18).

#### Materials

##### Little Red Riding Hood:

DK (8-ply) yarn: 5g (1/6oz), red

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of skin colour, golden brown and dark brown

Stuffing

##### Wolf:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of grey, white, brown and black

Stuffing

#### Size




Row 18: cast on 4 sts in white, keeping the colours correct, k to end (22).

Row 20: k.  
Row 21: p.  
Row 22: cast off 5 sts, k to end (17).  
Row 23: cast off 5 sts, p to end (12).  
Cast off.





## Tail

Cast on 8 sts with grey yarn.

Rows 1–8: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 9: (p2tog) to end (4).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Ears: make two

Cast on 5 sts with grey yarn.

Row 1: p2tog, p1, p2tog (3).

Row 2: k1, k2tog (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

Hide the fasten-off end of yarn inside the sts.

## Nose

Cast on 6 sts with brown yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## To make up

Sew the seams, stuff and flatten the base as shown on pages 16–18. Attach the ears, the tail and the nose. Embroider each eye with a French knot using black DK (8-ply) yarn.



# Three little pigs

## Instructions

### Pigs: make three

#### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 7 sts with pink yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (14).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (21).

Rows 5–15: st/st.

Row 16: (k1, k2tog, k1) to last st, k1 (16).

Row 17: p.

Row 18: k1, (k2tog, k1) to end (11).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 4 sts with pink yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: skpo, k2tog (2).

Row 3: p2tog and fasten off.

#### Snout

Cast on 10 sts with pink yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Tail

Make 6 chains with crochet hook and pink yarn. Fasten off.

#### To make up

Sew the body seam, stuff and flatten the base as shown on pages 16–18. Attach the ears, snout and tail. Using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and the nostrils with backstitch (see page 22).

#### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: 10g (1/3oz), pink

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of dark brown, or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn

Stuffing

#### Additional Equipment



# Snuggly pandas

## Instructions

### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 8 sts with pink or light blue yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (16).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (24).

Row 5: (p2, k1) to end.

Row 6: (p1, k2) to end.

Rows 7–16: repeat rows 5 and 6 five times.

Rows 17–26: change to white yarn and, starting with a p row, st/st.

Row 27: (p2, p2tog) to end (18).

Row 28: (k1, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Ears: make two

Cast on 9 sts with black yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Muzzle

Cast on 10 sts with white yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Eyes: make two

Cast on 10 sts with black fingering (4-ply) yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off (see page 20).

### Arms: make two

Cast on 6 sts with black yarn and work an i-cord for 5 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Scarf

Cast on 4 sts with light green or light yellow yarn and work an i-cord for 16cm (6¼in). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of pink, light blue, black, white, light green, light yellow and brown

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of black

Stuffing

## Size

6cm (2¼in) tall


## Difficulty level

Beginner

## To make up

Sew the body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Attach the arms, ears, and eyes. Attach the muzzle.

Using two strands of white DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the centre of each eye with a French knot (see page 22). Embroider the nose and mouth using black or brown yarn and backstitch. Attach the scarf. Use the picture for guidance.





# Bouncing balls

## Instructions

### Baseball

Make two pieces the same: one with cream yarn, one with light blue yarn.

Cast on 8 sts.

Row 1: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (10).

Row 2: kf/b, p to last st, kf/b (12).

Row 3: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (14).

Row 4: kf/b, p to last st, kf/b (16).

Row 5: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (18).

Row 6: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 7: k.

Row 8: as row 6.

Row 9: k.

Row 10: as row 6.

Row 11: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (16).

Row 12: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 13: k.

Row 14: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 15: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (14).

Row 16: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 17: k.

Row 18: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 19: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (12).

Row 20: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 21: k.

Rows 22–41: repeat rows 20 and 21 ten times.

Row 42: as row 20.

Row 43: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (14).

Row 44: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 45: k.

Row 46: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 47: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (16).

Row 48: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 49: k.

Row 50: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 51: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (18).

Row 52: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 53: k.

Row 54: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 55: k.

Row 56: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 57: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (20).

Row 58: k2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 59: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (18).

Row 60: k2tog, p to last 2 sts, k2tog (16).

Row 61: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (14).

Row 62: k2tog, p to last 2 sts, k2tog (12).


Row 63: k2tog, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (10).

Row 64: k2tog, p to last 2 sts, k2tog (8).

Cast off.

### To make up

Mark the centre of each edge on both knitted pieces. Using the diagram for guidance, match the centre of one short edge (A) on one knitted piece to the centre of one long edge (A) on the other knitted piece. Match the other edges in the same way and sew the seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam.

DK (8-ply) yarn: 10g (1/3oz), cream

DK (8-ply) yarn: 10g (1/3oz), light blue

Stuffing

#### Basketball:

DK (8-ply) yarn: 10g (1/3oz), light brown

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amount of dark brown

Stuffing

### Size

8cm (3¼in) diameter

### Difficulty level

Beginner

## Basketball

Follow the pattern given for the baseball, using light brown yarn. Add the embroidery with chain stitches using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn (see page 23).





# Scrumptious cupcakes

## Instructions

The cupcakes can be knitted flat, if you prefer. Simply continue knitting flat in st/st after row 8, and sew the seam at the end.

## Strawberry cupcake

Starting with the base, cast on 7 sts loosely with white yarn.

Row 1: kf/b in each st (14).

Row 2: p.

Row 3: (k1, kf/b) to end (21).

Row 4: p.

Row 5: (k2, kf/b) to end (28).

Row 6: p.

Row 7: (k3, kf/b) to end (35).

Row 8: k for fold line, inc one st at the end of the row (36).

Divide sts equally on 3 needles and start working in rounds.

Rounds 9–20: (k2, p1) to end.

Round 21: p for the edge.

Break off white yarn and change to beige yarn.

Rounds 22–32: k.

Round 33: (k2, k2tog) to end (27).

Rounds 34–35: k.

Round 36: (k2, k2tog) to last 3 sts, k3 (21).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Whipped cream

Cast on 20 sts with white fleecy, chunky or bouclé yarn and 4mm (UK 8, US 6) needles and k1 row.

Row 2: (p2tog) to end (10).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Strawberry

Cast on 12 sts with green yarn.

Row 1: p.

Join in red yarn.

Row 2: (k3 green, k1 red) to end.

Row 3: (p1 red, p3 green) to end.

Break off green yarn and continue in red yarn only.

Rows 4–7: st/st.

Row 8: (k2, k2tog) to end (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

Sew the seam from the fasten-off end and stuff.

## To make up

Starting at the fasten-off end of the whipped cream, sew the side seam. Starting at the fasten-off end of the strawberry, sew the seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten off. Embroider dots on the strawberry with two strands taken from white DK (8-ply) yarn. See the picture for guidance. Sew the cupcake seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Attach the whipped cream and the strawberry securely to the top of the cupcake.

## Materials

### Strawberry cupcake:

DK (8-ply) yarn: 4g (1/8oz)  
each of beige and white

Fleecy, chunky yarn or  
bouclé yarn: small  
amounts of white

*Note: If the bouclé yarn is very fine, you could knit with two strands of the yarn held together.*

DK (8-ply) yarn: small  
amounts of red and green

Stuffing

### Cupcake with frosting:

DK (8-ply) yarn:  
4g (1/8oz) white

DK (8-ply) yarn: 3g (1/10oz)  
beige and pink

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amount  
of dark brown

Stuffing

## Additional equipment

A pair of 4mm (UK 8, US 6)  
knitting needles

## Size

Strawberry cupcake: 5cm (2in)  
diameter, 8cm (8 1/4in) tall

Cupcake with frosting:  
5cm (2in) diameter,  
6cm (2 1/4in) tall

## Difficulty level

Beginner

## Cupcake with frosting

Follow the instructions for the strawberry cupcake until round 30.

Round 31: (k2, k2tog) to end (27).

Round 32: k.

Round 33: (k2, k2tog) to last 3 sts, k3 (21).

Round 34: (k1, k2tog) to end (14).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Frosting

Cast on 9 sts with pink yarn.

Row 1: (k2, p1) to end.

Row 2: (k1, p2) to end.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until the piece measures 14cm (5½in).

Cast off.

### To make up

Make up the cupcake with frosting as for the strawberry cupcake. Sew the side seams of the frosting, roll the piece from one end and shape. Secure it to the top of the cupcake. For the chocolate sprinkles, embroider dots on the cream with dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn. See the picture for guidance.



# Choo-choo train

## Instructions

The engine is knitted from the left panel and moves on to the roof panel, the right panel and the base panel. The front and back panels (knitted in green yarn) are created from stitches picked up from the roof edges. The very front panel, which creates the front of the engine (knitted in beige yarn) is created from stitches picked up from the main part of the engine. Refer to the marking threads throughout the pattern.

## Engine

Cast on 14 sts with beige yarn.

Rows 1–4: (left panel) st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: k for fold line.

Join in green yarn.

Row 6: k5 green, turn. Leave the beige sts on a stitch holder and work on the 5 sts in green yarn first.

Rows 7–14: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 15: k for fold line. Leave a red marking thread at the beginning of the row and a blue marking thread at the end of the row.

Rows 16–24 (roof panel): st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 25: k for fold line. Leave a red marking thread at the beginning of the row and a blue marking thread at the end of the row.

Rows 26–33 (right panel): st/st, starting with a k row. Leave the sts on a second stitch holder.

Back panel: with green yarn and the right side facing, pick up 7 sts between the two red marking threads, turn and st/st 12 rows, starting with a p row (WS). Cast off.

Front panel: with green yarn and

the right side facing, pick up 7 sts between the two blue marking threads, turn and st/st 8 rows, starting with a p row (WS). Cast off.

Go back to the beige sts you left at row 6, on stitch holder 1. With right side facing, rejoin beige yarn and k to end (9). Leave a yellow marking thread at the end of the row.

St/st 6 more rows, starting with a p row. Do not break the yarn. With right side facing, transfer the 5 sts on stitch holder 2 to the right side of the beige stitches you have just been working on. The previous row number is used from this point.

Row 34 (right panel) (WS): with beige yarn, p across the row to connect the green and beige sts (14). Leave a yellow marking thread at the beginning of the row.

Row 35: p for fold line.

Rows 36–39: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 40: k for fold line.

Rows 41–49 (base panel): st/st, starting with a k row. Cast off.

Front panel of the beige main body piece: with beige yarn and the right side facing, pick up 7 sts between the two yellow marking threads, turn and st/st 4 rows, starting with a p row (WS). Cast off.

## Front box

This box has one open end. The open end will be attached to the green front panel of the engine.

Cast on 9 sts with pink yarn.

Rows 1–5: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 6: k for fold line.

Rows 7–11: st/st, starting with a k row.

## Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of beige, green, pink, cream, brown, dark pink, blue, orange and yellow

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of red, blue, and yellow for stitch markers

Stuffing

## Additional equipment

Two spare needles or stitch holders

## Size

Train, 5cm (2in) wide, 21cm (8¼in) long with all carriages connected

## Difficulty level

Intermediate

Row 12: cast on 5 sts, p these sts, k to end for fold line (14).

Rows 13–17: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 18: cast off 5 sts, k to end for fold line (9).

Rows 19–23: st/st, starting with a k row. Cast off.

## Wheels: make eight

Cast on 3 sts with cream yarn and work in g-st for 22 rows. Change to brown yarn and work in g-st for 22 rows. Cast off.

## Roof

Cast on 10 sts with dark pink yarn and work in g-st for 13 rows. Cast off.

## Chimney

Cast on 6 sts with dark pink yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Windows: make two

Cast on 8 sts with dark pink yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Carriages: make two

Cast on 12 sts with blue or orange yarn.

Rows 1–7: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 8: cast on 6 sts, p these sts, k to end for fold line (18).

Row 9: cast on 6 sts, k to end (24).

Rows 10–17: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 18: cast off 6 sts, k to end for fold line (18).

Row 19: cast off 6 sts, k to end (12).

Rows 20–25: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 26: k for fold line.

Rows 27–35: st/st, starting with a k row.

Cast off.

## Connecting pieces: make two

Cast on 2 sts with yellow yarn and work an i-cord for 6 rows. Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## To make up

Sew the seams of the engine, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Sew the seams of the front box and stuff. Attach the open end of the front box to the green front panel of the engine. Attach the roof, chimney and windows.

Sew the seams of each carriage, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam.

Starting at the cream coloured end, roll up each wheel piece and secure with a few stitches using brown yarn. Attach the wheels to the engine and carriages – see the picture for guidance. Attach the connecting pieces to connect the carriages together.





# Cute cats and marvellous mice

## Instructions

### Cat

#### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 7 sts with beige or honey-yellow yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (14).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (21).

Rows 5–15: st/st.

Row 16: (k1, k2tog, k1) to last st, k1 (16).

Row 17: p.

Row 18: k1, (k2tog, k1) to end (11).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Muzzle

Cast on 14 sts with white yarn.

Next row: p2, (p2tog, p2) to end (11).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 4 sts with beige or honey-yellow yarn.

Row 1: (p2tog) twice (2).

Row 2: skpo and fasten off.

#### Tail

Cast on 2 sts with beige or honey-yellow yarn and work an i-cord for 15 rows (see page 21). Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### To make up

Sew the body seam, stuff and flatten the base as shown on pages 16–18. Hide the yarn ends of each ear and attach the ears to the body. Attach the muzzle with the purl side out. Work a gathering thread around the centre of the muzzle to shape. Using two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the eyes and the nose with French knots and the mouth with backstitch (see page 22). Using two strands taken from brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the whiskers with backstitch. Embroider the stripes using brown DK (8-ply) yarn and backstitch. Attach the tail.

### Mouse

#### Body and head

Cast on 6 sts with white yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (12).

Rows 3–11: st/st.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of beige, honey-yellow, white, dark brown and brown

Stuffing

#### Additional equipment

3mm (UK 11, US C/2 or D/3) crochet hook

#### Size

Cat: 4cm (1½in) tall

Mouse: 2cm (¾in) tall

*Note: the mouse is tiny. Please take care if you give it to a young child.*

#### Difficulty level

Beginner

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 3 sts with white yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Tail

Make 10 chains with a crochet hook and white yarn. Fasten off.

#### To make up

Sew the body seam, stuff and flatten the base as shown on pages 16–18. Attach the ears and tail. Using two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the eyes and the nose with French knots and the mouth with backstitch (see page 22).

Using two strands taken from brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the whiskers with backstitch.





# Balancing baby clowns

## Instructions

### Body, head and legs

#### Right leg

Cast on 7 sts with lilac yarn or pink yarn and st/st 5 rows, starting with a p row.

Break yarn and keep the sts on a spare needle or a holder.

#### Left leg

Follow the instructions given for the right leg, but do not break off the yarn. With right side facing, place the right leg on the left side of the left leg on the same needle and continue.

Row 6: k6, k2tog, k6 (13).

Rows 7–11: st/st.

Row 12: k1, (k2tog, k1) to end (9).

Change to skin colour yarn.

Row 13: p.

Row 14: k2, kf/b, k3, kf/b, k2 (11).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k2, k2tog) to last 3 sts, k3 (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Hat

Cast on 13 sts with lilac yarn or pink yarn.

Rows 1–5: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 6: (p2tog) to last st, p1 (7).

Row 7: k.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with lilac or pink yarn and work an i-cord for 4 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### To make up

Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the head and body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff, avoiding the neck area and close the seam. Work a gathering thread around the neck with skin colour yarn, pull tightly and fasten off. Sew each leg seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam.

Attach the arms. Sew the seam on the hat and attach it to the head. Attach a length of white fleecy, chunky or bouclé yarn around the neck. Embroider each eye with a French knot using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn.

#### Ball

Cast on 24 sts with yellow yarn.

Row 1: (p4 yellow, p4 light green, p4 light blue) twice.

Rows 2–11: keeping the colours correct, st/st.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### To make up

Starting at the fasten-off end of the ball, sew the seam and stuff. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten off to shape the ball.





Row 8: k light blue.

Row 9: p light blue.

Row 10: k blue. Slide sts to end of needle and continue.

Row 11: k light blue.

Row 12: (p1, p2tog, p1) to end with light blue (15). Slide sts to end of needle and continue.

Row 13: p blue.

Row 14: k light blue.

Row 15: p light blue.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Head

Starting with the back of the head, cast on 9 sts with white yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (18).

Rows 3–8: st/st.

Row 9: (p2tog, p1) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Feet: make two

Starting with the back of the foot, cast on 8 sts with white yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: k.

Row 3: (p1, pf/b) to last 2 sts, p2 (11).

Rows 4–7: st/st.

Row 8: k2, k2tog, k3, k2tog, k2 (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Arms: make two

Cast on 6 sts with white yarn and work an i-cord for 5 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 4 sts with white yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: p1, p2tog, p1 (3).

Row 6: skpo, k1 (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### Float

Cast on 10 sts with white yarn and, starting with a k row, work in striped st/st (4 rows white, 3 rows red) five times.

Cast off.

#### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: 20g (¾oz), white for both bunnies

DK (8-ply) yarn: 4g (1/8oz) light blue and light pink

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of blue, red, pink and yellow

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of dark brown or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn

Stuffing

Standing: 8cm (3¼in)

Sitting: 7cm (2¾in)

Follow the instructions given for the blue bunny. Attach the feet on the sides of the body instead of the base of the body.

Omit the float.



Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: p1, p2tog, p2, p2tog, p1 (6).

Row 6: k.

Row 7: (p2tog) to end (3).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Arms: make two

Cast on 7 sts with white yarn and work an i-cord for 5 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### To make up

Sew the body and head seam. Stuff the head. Work a gathering thread around the neck, pull tightly and fasten off. Starting at the fasten-off end of the muzzle, sew the seam following the instructions given on page 20 and make it into a circle.

Attach the arms, ears and muzzle.

Using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and a nose and mouth with backstitch. Embroider whiskers with two strands taken from light brown DK (8-ply) yarn.



## Cat

### Body and head

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit until row 30, using light blue yarn for the body and dark grey yarn for the head. Cast off instead of drawing through sts.

### Muzzle

Cast on 18 sts with white yarn.  
Row 1: p2, (p2tog, p2) to end (14).  
Row 2: (k2tog) to end (7).  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Arms: make two

Cast on 7 sts with light blue yarn.  
Rows 1–2: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 3: k.

With the right side facing, join dark grey yarn.

Rows 4–5: st/st, starting with a k row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Sew the body and head seam. Stuff the head. Work a gathering thread around the neck, pull tightly and fasten off. With the body and

head seam at the centre of the back, sew across the cast-off sts, to form the top of the head. Sew through both layers of the top corners of the head to create triangular ears. Embroider the centre of the ears with white DK (8-ply) yarn and backstitch. Seam the arms without stuffing, and attach them. Starting at the fasten-off end of the muzzle, sew the seam. Attach the muzzle to the face, leaving a small opening for stuffing. Stuff and finish sewing. Using black DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and a nose with backstitch. Using two strands taken from pink DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider three whiskers on either side of the nose.



## Bear

### Body and head

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, using yellow yarn for the body and brown yarn for the head.

### Arms: make two

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, using brown yarn.

### Muzzle

Follow the instructions given for the cat, using beige yarn.

### Ears: make two

Cast on 8 sts with brown yarn.  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, omitting the whiskers.

## Dog

### Body and head

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, using green yarn for the body and beige yarn for the head.

### Arms: make two

Follow the instructions given for the cat, using green yarn and beige yarn.

### Muzzle

Follow the instructions given for the cat, using white yarn.

### Ears: make two

Cast on 8 sts with brown yarn.  
Row 1: p.  
Row 2: k1, k2tog, k2, k2tog, k1 (6).  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, omitting the whiskers.

## Pig

### Body and head

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, using beige yarn for the body and light pink yarn for the head.

### Arms: make two

Follow the instructions given for the rabbit, using light pink yarn.

### Ears: make two



Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

Row 6: cast off 3 sts, p to end (7).

#### Large back spikes: make three

Row 60: p2tog, p to last 2 sts, p2tog (18).

Cast off.

Row 6: cast off 3 sts, p to end (7).

Row 7: cast off 3 sts, k to end (4).

Row 8: p.

Row 9: k.

Row 10: cast on 3 sts, p to end (7).

Row 11: cast on 3 sts, k to end (10).

Rows 12–16: st/st.

Cast off.

## To make up

Sew the neck and head seam, folding the piece vertically and stuff. Make up the body and tail as for the stegosaurus (page 64). Attach the under-body, leaving a gap for stuffing; when you attach the under-body, the legs are created. Stuff and close the seam. Secure the base of the neck to the body to keep the head upright. See the picture for guidance. With yellow yarn, embroider the spots with short backstitch. With dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and the nose and mouth with backstitch (see page 22).



## Large horns: make two

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## Small horn: make one

Cast on 3 sts with white yarn.

Next row: p2tog, p1 (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## To make up

Make up the body, head, legs and tail as for the stegosaurus (page 64); when you attach the under-body, the legs are created. Attach the neck piece to the body. Attach the horns. With dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and the nose and mouth with backstitch (see page 22). With light orange yarn, embroider the back with long backstitches.

### Beak

Cast on 7 sts with orange yarn.  
Row 1: p2tog, p3, p2tog (5).  
Row 2: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).  
Row 3: p2tog, p1 (2).  
Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

### Scarf

Cast on 3 sts with fine kid mohair yarn or fingering (4-ply) yarn in your choice of colour. Work an i-cord for 12cm (4¾in) (see page 21). Cast off.  
Make small tassels with backstitch and matching yarn, leaving a loop every other stitch. Cut the loops to make the tassels.

### To make up

Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the body and head seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten. Stuff the body and head and close the seam. Fold each wing vertically and attach to the body. Attach the beak. Using two strands taken from white DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with tiny backstitches. Attach the feet and the scarf.

### **Antenna**

Cast on 3 sts with grey yarn and work an i-cord for 7 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

For the light, cast on 10 sts with yellow yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts and pull tightly. Attach it to the end of the antenna.

### **To make up**

Sew the seam of the top piece, halfway along. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten off. Stuff and close the seam.

For the disk, work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten off. Sew the seam of the disk, halfway along. Insert the cardboard circle and close the seam. Attach the disk to the top piece, using the picture for guidance. Make up the yellow domes in the same way as the top piece and attach them under the disk. Sew the seam of each window and attach around the top piece. Attach the antenna to the top.

## Yellow alien

### Body and head

Cast on 5 sts with yellow yarn.  
Row 1: p.  
Row 2: kf/b in each st (10).  
Row 3: k for edge.  
Rows 4–7: st/st, starting with a k row.  
Row 8: (k2tog) to end (5).

Row 10: kf/b in each st (10).  
Row 11: p.  
Row 12: k.  
Row 13: (p2, pf/b) to last st, p1 (13).  
Row 14: k.  
Row 15: p.  
Row 16: (k2tog) to last st, k1 (7).  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Feet: make two

Cast on 3 sts with yellow yarn and st/st 7 rows, starting with a k row. Cast off.

### Eyes: make two

Cast on 8 sts with dark grey fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark grey DK (8-ply) yarn. Break off yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Make up the body and head and flatten the base following the instructions on pages 16–18. Make up the eyes following the instructions on page 20 and sew them to the body, stretching one end to make a slightly oval shape. Attach the feet to the base of the body. See the picture for guidance.



## Googly-eyed alien

### Body

Cast on 4 sts with light green yarn.  
Row 1: kf/b in each st (8).  
Row 2: k for the edge.  
Row 3: (k1, kf/b) to end (12).  
Row 4: p.  
Row 5: (k1, kf/b) to end (18).  
Rows 6–10: st/st.  
Row 11: (k1, k2tog) to end (12).  
Row 12: p.  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Eyes: make two

Cast on 10 sts with white fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from white DK (8-ply) yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Antennae: make two


For the first antenna, cast on 2 sts with light green yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows (see page 21).  
For the second antenna, cast on 2 sts with light green yarn and work an i-cord for 6 rows.

### Feet: make two

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with purple yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows (see page 21). Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

### Eyes: make three

Cast on 6 sts with purple yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Make up the body and head and flatten the base following the instructions on pages 16–18.

Make up the eyes following the instructions on page 20 and attach them to the body. Using dark grey fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark grey DK (8-ply), embroider the centre of each eye with a French knot. Attach the arms and the antenna. Attach the top of the antenna.



## One-eyed alien

### Body

Cast on 5 sts with blue-green yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (10).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (15).

Row 5: k for the edge.

Rows 6–7: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 8: (k2, k2tog) to last 3 sts, k3 (12).

Rows 9–14: st/st.

Row 15: (p1, p2tog) to end (8).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.



## Outer eye piece

Cast on 12 sts with white yarn.  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Inner eye piece


Cast on 6 sts with light blue yarn.  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Antennae: make two

Cast on 2 sts with blue-green yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows.

Row 9: (p2tog) to end (5).

Row 10: kf/b in each st (10).

Row 11: p.

Row 12: (k1, kf/b) to end (15).

Rows 13–17: st/st.

Row 18: (k1, k2tog) to end (10).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Horn

Cast on 3 sts with mid-blue yarn.

Next row: sl1, p2tog (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

### Legs: make two

Cast on 3 sts with mid-blue yarn and st/st 4 rows, starting with a k row. Cast off.

### Eyes: make two

Cast on 8 sts with white fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from white DK (8-ply) yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Make up the body and head and flatten the base following the instructions on pages 16–18. Make up the eyes following the instructions on page 20 and attach them to the head. Using dark grey fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark grey DK (8-ply), embroider the centre of each eye with a French knot. Using mid-blue yarn, create a nose by backstitching on the same spot three times. Attach the legs and the horn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Head

Starting with the back of the head, cast on 9 sts with cream yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (18).

Rows 3–8: st/st.

Row 9: (p1, p2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Feet: make two

Starting with the back of the foot, cast on 8 sts with dark brown yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: k.

Row 3: (p1, pf/b) to last 2 sts, p2 (11).

Rows 4–7: st/st.

Row 8: k2, k2tog, k3, k2tog, k2 (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Arms: make two

Cast on 6 sts with light green yarn and work an i-cord for 5 rows.

Join in cream yarn and work an i-cord for one more row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 6 sts with cream yarn.

Next row: p1, p2tog, p2tog, p1 (4).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Tail

Cast on 2 sts with cream yarn and work an i-cord for 8 rows.

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### Coat

Cast on 24 sts with light green yarn and st/st 12 rows, starting with a k row.

Next row: (k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Scarf

Cast on 3 sts with orange yarn and work an i-cord for 7cm (2¾in).

Cast off.

#### To make up

Sew the body, head and feet seams, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seams. Attach the head, feet and arms to the body. Attach the ears to the head. Starting with the back of the foot, cast on 7 sts with dark brown yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 3: (p1, pf/b) to last st, p1 (10).

Rows 4–7: st/st.

Row 8: k2, (k2tog, k2) twice (8).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Coat

Cast on 20 sts with blue yarn and st/st 10 rows, starting with a k row.

Next row: (k2tog) to end (10).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Arms: make two

Cast on 6 sts with blue yarn and work an i-cord for 4 rows.

Join in cream yarn and work an

i-cord for one more row. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Ears and tail

As given for the big mouse.

## Scarf

Cast on 3 sts with red yarn and work an i-cord for 6cm (2¼in).

Cast off.

Follow the instructions given for the big mouse.

Change to light yellow yarn.

Row 17: p.

Row 18: k4, (kf/b) eight times, turn, p16, turn, sl1, k to end (24).

Rows 19–21: st/st.

Row 22: k4, (k2tog, k1) five times, k2tog, k3 (18).

Rows 23–27: st/st.

Row 28: k2, (k2tog, k2) to end (14).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Wings: make two

Cast on 10 sts with light yellow yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: p1, (p2tog, p1) to end (7).

Row 6: k.

Row 7: (p2tog) three times, p1 (4).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Beak

Cast on 3 sts with orange yarn.

Rows 1–2: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 3: skpo, k1 (2).

Row 4: p2tog and fasten off.

### Tail

Cast on 12 sts with light yellow yarn.

Row 1: (k2, p1) to end.

Row 2: (k1, p2) to end.

Row 3: (k2tog, p1) to end (8).

Rows 4–8: work in k1, p1 rib.

Row 9: (p2tog) to end (4).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Feet: make two

With light pink yarn and a crochet hook, \* make 4 chains, miss 2 chains, ss to next 2 chains. Repeat from \* three more times.

Fasten off.

### Cheek circles: make two

Cast on 8 sts with two strands taken from light blue DK (8-ply) yarn. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Starting at the fasten-off end of the body and head, sew the head seam. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten. Sew the rest of the body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff the body, avoiding the neck area and close the seam. Work a gathering thread along the



Cast on 5 sts with light pink yarn and work an i-cord for 4 rows.

Cast on 5 sts with light pink yarn and work an i-cord for 5 rows.

Change to skin colour yarn and work one row more.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Hat

Cast on 24 sts with light pink yarn.

Rows 1–2: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 3: (p2, p2tog) to end (18).

Row 4: (k2tog) to end (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 4 sts with light pink yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 5: k1, k2tog, k1 (3).

Row 6: p2tog, p1 (2).

Row 7: k2tog and fasten off.

#### To make up

Sew the body and head seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff, avoiding the neck area, and close the seam. Work a gathering thread around the neck, pull tightly and fasten off.

Flatten the base following the instructions on pages 17–18.

Attach the hat, arms, feet and ears. Attach a length of white chunky, fleecy yarn around the neck. Using light brown fingering (4-ply) yarn, backstitch, leaving small loops every stitch to create hair. Use the picture for guidance. Using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn embroider a French knot for each eye. Create a nose by backstitching several times on the same spot in the centre of the face with skin colour DK (8-ply) yarn.

### Bee baby

#### Body, head, feet, arms and hat

Follow the instructions given for the bunny baby. For the body and head, work rows 1–6 with dark brown yarn, rows 7–8 with yellow yarn, rows 9–10 with dark brown yarn, rows 11–16 with yellow yarn and rows 17–26 with skin colour yarn. Use dark brown for the feet, dark brown and skin colour for the arms and yellow for the hat.

#### Antennae: make two

Cast on 2 sts with white yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows (see page 21). Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### To make up

Make up as for the bunny baby, using light brown for the hair.

### Bear baby

#### Body, head, arms, feet and hat

Follow the instructions given for the bunny baby, using brown and skin colour yarn for the body and head and arms and brown for the hat and feet.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 8 sts with brown yarn.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### To make up

Make up as for the bunny baby, omitting the chunky fleecy yarn around the neck.



# Cute kangaroos

## Instructions

### Mummy

#### Body

Starting with the base, cast on 10 sts with beige yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (20).

Rows 3–13: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 14: (k1, k2tog, k1) to end (15).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Head

Starting with the back of the head, cast on 8 sts with beige yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (16).

Rows 3–9: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 10: (k1, k2tog, k1) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Feet: make two

Starting with the sole of foot, cast on 6 sts with beige yarn.

Row 1: kf/b in each st (12).

Rows 2–4: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: k3, (k3tog) twice, k3 (8).

Rows 6–9: st/st.

Row 10: (p2tog) to end (4).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Tail

Cast on 13 sts with beige yarn.

Rows 1–3: st/st starting with a p row.

Row 4: (k2, k2tog) to last st, k1 (10).

Rows 5–8: st/st.

Row 9: p2, (p2tog, p2) to end (8).

Row 10: k.

Row 11: (p2tog) to end (4).

Row 12: (k2tog) to end (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### Arms: make two

Cast on 6 sts with beige yarn and work an i-cord for 6 rows (see page 21).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 5 sts with beige yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Dungarees

Cast on 25 sts with red yarn or pink yarn.

Rows 1–12: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 13: (k1, k2tog, k1) to last st, k1 (19).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Straps: make two

Make 13 chains with red yarn or pink yarn and a crochet hook. Fasten off.

DK (8-ply) yarn: 20g (¾oz), beige for both kangaroos

DK (8-ply) yarn: 4g (1/8oz), red or pink

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of dark brown or use two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn

3mm (UK 11, US C/2 or D/3) crochet hook

Mummy: 7cm (2¾in) tall

*Note: the joey is tiny. Sew firmly in place if it is to be given to a small child.*

## To make up

Sew the body, head, tail and feet seams, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seams. Work a gathering thread around the face to make the eye line (optional). Attach the head to the body. Sew the dungaree seam and attach to the body with the seam at the back. Attach the feet and the tail. Attach the arms and the dungaree straps. Attach the ears to the head. Using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and a nose and mouth with backstitch.

# Joey

## Body

Cast on 9 sts with beige yarn.  
Rows 1–3: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 4: (k2tog, k1) to end (6).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.



## Head

Cast on 9 sts with beige yarn and st/st 3 rows starting with a p row.  
Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Ears: make two

Cast on 2 sts with beige yarn.

Row 1: p.

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with beige yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows. Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## To make up

Assemble the joey's body, head, arms and ears and embroider the face as for the mummy. Insert the joey into the mummy's dungarees, securing firmly with a few stitches if given to a small child.



# Playful puppies

## Instructions

Work the body and legs as one, starting with the hind legs and finishing with the front legs.

### Right hind leg

Cast on 7 sts with beige yarn and st/st 6 rows, starting with a k row. Break yarn, and keep the sts on a spare needle or a stitch holder.

### Left hind leg

Follow the instructions given for the right hind leg, but do not break off the yarn. With right side facing, place the right hind leg on the left side of the left hind leg on the same needle and continue.

Row 7: k across all sts to connect the two legs (14).

Rows 8–10: st/st, starting with a p row.

Shape the bottom:

Row 11: k9, yf, sl1, yb, turn, sl1, p4, yb, sl1, yf, turn, sl1, k to end (14).

Rows 12–16: st/st.

### Front legs

Work the front legs one at a time.

Row 17: k7, turn, p to end.

Row 18: k7, turn, p to end.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

With right side facing, rejoin yarn to remaining 7 sts.

Rows 19–22: st/st, starting with a k row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Head

Starting with the back of the head, cast on 7 sts with beige yarn.

Row 1: k1, (kf/b) to end (13).

Rows 2–6: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 7: k1, (k2tog, k1) to end (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Ears: make two

Cast on 5 sts with brown yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Tail

Cast on 4 sts with brown yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: k1, skpo, k1 (3).

Row 3: p.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Sew each leg seam, leaving a small gap in the bottom centre of the body. Stuff the body and close the seam. Sew the seam of the head, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff the head and close the seam. Attach the head to the body, with the seam underneath. Attach the ears and tail. Using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider a French knot for each eye and a nose with backstitch.

Rows 1–5: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 6: (k1, k2tog) to last 2 sts, k2tog (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Ears: make two

Cast on 2 sts with the colour of your choice and p 1 row. Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### Tail

Cast on 2 sts with the colour of your choice and work an i-cord for 3cm (1¼in) or desired length. Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

#### To make up

To create the legs, fold the corners of the body square towards each other and sew them from the tip, using overcast stitch. Stuff the body and sew the seam.

Starting at the fasten-off end of the head, sew the seam and stuff.

Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten to close. Hide the fasten-off yarn end of each ear inside the stitches. Attach the head, ears and tail to the body.

Using dark brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and embroider a nose with backstitch (see page 22). With light brown fingering (4-ply) yarn or two strands taken from light brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider the whiskers with backstitch

### Ball of yarn

Thread a 70cm (27½in) length of DK (8-ply) yarn in the colour of your choice on to a sewing needle.

\* Roll it from the other, unthreaded end, four or five times, to make a tiny ball and stitch through the ball to secure in place. Repeat from \*, several times, until the ball is the right size, leaving a yarn end of your desired length.

### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amount in the colour of your choice

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amounts of dark brown and light brown, or two strands taken from dark brown and light brown DK (8-ply) yarn

Stuffing

### Size

Cat: 4cm (1½in) long

Ball of yarn: 1cm (½in) in diameter

Intermediate

Rows 19–21: st/st.

Row 22: k3, (k1, k2tog) four times, k to end (14).

Rows 23–25: st/st.

Row 26: k2 (k2tog, k2) to end (11).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Skirt

Cast on 36 sts with light blue or pink yarn and st/st four rows, starting with p row.

Next row: (p2tog) to end (18)

Cast off.

### Arms: make two

Cast on 4 sts with skin colour yarn and work an i-cord for 6 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Legs: make two

Cast on 4 sts with skin colour yarn and work an i-cord for 10 rows.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Wings

Cast on 35 sts with white mohair yarn on 4mm (UK 8, US 6) needles.

Row 1: k.

Row 2: p2tog, p to last 2 sts, p2tog (33).

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until there are 25 sts left.

Decrease 1 st at both ends of every row until there are 17 sts left. Cast off.

### To make up

Sew the head and the body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff, avoiding the neck area, and close the seam. Work a gathering thread around the neck and pull tightly. Work a gathering thread for the eye line (optional). Flatten the base of the body as shown on pages 17–18. Attach the arms to the sides of the body. Attach the legs to the front edge of the base of the body. Sew the seam of the skirt and attach the skirt to the waist, with the seam at the back. Using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider a French knot for each eye. Create a nose by backstitching the same spot three times using skin colour DK (8-ply) yarn. To create the hair, take two strands from brown DK (8-ply) yarn and wrap them around four fingers twenty-five to thirty times – you can control the length of the hair as you wish. Attach the hair as shown on page 19, then trim the loop ends at the bottom.

### Materials

DK (8-ply) yarn: 6g (1/5oz), light blue or pink

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of skin colour, brown and dark brown

Fine mohair: small amount of white for the wings

Stuffing

### Additional equipment

A pair of 4mm (UK 8, US 6) knitting needles

### Size

8cm (3¼in) tall

### Difficulty level

Beginner

To make up the wings, work a gathering thread from the centre of the cast-off edge of the wings to the centre of the cast-on edge of the wings, pull tightly and fasten. Hide the yarn ends inside the stitches and attach the wings to the back of the body.



# Up-and-away!

## Instructions

### Balloon

Cast on 6 sts with white yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (12).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: kf/b in each st (24).

Row 5: p.

Row 6: (k1, kf/b) to end (36).

Row 7: p.

Row 8: (k2, kf/b) to end (48).

Join in the six colours for the balloon, twisting the yarns at the back of the work when changing colour.

Row 9: p8 yellow, p8 light green, p8 light blue, p8 light purple, p8 red, p8 orange.

Row 10: keeping the colours correct, p for the edge.

Rows 11–25: keeping the colours correct, st/st, starting with a p row. Continue in st/st, keeping the colours correct whilst increasing and decreasing.

Row 26: (k2, kf/b, k2, kf/b, k2) to end (60).

Rows 27–33: st/st.

Row 34: (k2, k2tog) twice, (k4, k2tog, k2, k2tog) five times, k2 (48).

Row 35: p.

Row 36: (k2, k2tog) to end (36).

Row 37: p.

Row 38: (k1, k2tog) to end (24).

Row 39: p.

Row 40: (k2tog) to end (12).

Row 41: p.

Row 42: (k2tog) to end (6).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Basket

Using light brown yarn, follow the instructions given for the balloon until row 6.

Row 7: k for edge.

Rows 8–14: st/st, starting with a k row.

Rows 15–16: k.

Row 17: k for fold line.

Rows 18–19: st/st, starting with a k row.

Cast off.

### To make up

Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the seam of the balloon halfway along. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge, pull tightly and fasten off. Stuff and close the seam.

To make up the basket, work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge and pull tightly. Sew the rest of the seam. Fold the piece at the folding line and secure the cast-off edge to the inner side of the basket.

Attach four strands of light brown yarn to the basket and connect the basket to the balloon. See the picture for guidance. Using white yarn, make a loop at the top of the balloon, to hang it up.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (12).

Row 5: k for edge.

Row 6: k.

Row 7: (p1, pf/b, p1) to end (16).

Row 8: change to light blue yarn and k.

Join in white yarn.

Row 9: p with white yarn, do not break yarn.

Row 10: k with light blue yarn. Slide the sts to the end of the needle and continue.

Row 11: k with white yarn.

Break off white yarn.

Row 12: (p2, p2tog) to end with light blue yarn (12).

Break off light blue yarn.

Slide the sts to the end of the needle and continue.

Row 13: change to skin colour yarn and p.

Row 14: (k2, kf/b) to end (16).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with skin colour yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Cap

Cast on 17 sts with blue yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: k.

Row 3: (p2, p2tog) to last st, p1 (13).

Row 4: (k2, k2tog) to last st, k1 (10).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Cap visor

With the right side facing and blue yarn, pick up 8 sts from the front edge of the cap.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (6). Cast off.

## To make up

Follow the instructions given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base.

Attach the arms. Seam the cap and then attach it. Using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot.

Create a nose by backstitching on the same spot three times with skin colour yarn.



# Dog

## Body

Cast on 6 sts with white yarn.

Row 1: kf/b in each st (12).

Row 2: k for edge.

Rows 3–6: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 7: (k1, k2tog, k1) to end (9).

Row 8: p.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Head

Cast on 12 sts with white yarn and st/st 4 rows, starting with p row.

Next row: (p1, p2tog) to end (8).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Ears: make two

Cast on 2 sts with white yarn, skpo and fasten off.

## To make up

Sew the head seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Sew the body seam, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Attach the head to the body and the ears to the head. Using two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot and create a nose by backstitching on the same spot three times.

Row 26: p.

Row 27: k12, kf/b, k9, kf/b, k8, kf/b, k to end (47).

Row 30: p.

Row 31: k14, kf/b, k10, kf/b, k9, kf/b, k to end (53).

Row 37: cast on 8, k these sts, k13, kf/b, k21, kf/b, k to end (59).

Rows 40–48: st/st.

Row 49: cast off 8 sts, k to end (61).

Row 50: cast off 8 sts, p to end (53).

Row 51: cast off 8 sts, k to end (45).

Row 52: cast off 8 sts, p22, yb, sl1, yf, turn.

Row 53: sl1, k11, yf, sl1, yb, turn.

Row 54: sl1, p11, yb, sl1, yf, turn.

Row 55: sl1, k11, yf, sl1, yb, turn.

Row 56: sl1, p to end.

Row 57: k9, k2tog, k15, k2tog, k to end (35).

Row 58: p9, p2tog, p13, p2tog, p to end (33).

Row 59: k9, k2tog, k11, k2tog, k to end (31).

Row 60: p9, p2tog, p9, p2tog, p to end (29).

Row 61: k9, k2tog, k7, k2tog, k to end (27).

Rows 62–65: st/st.

Row 66: p, decreasing 1 st at each end of the row (25).

Rows 67–71: st/st.

Row 72: p, decreasing 1 st at each end of the row (23).

Rows 73–79: st/st.

Row 80: p, decreasing 1 st at each end of the row (21).

Rows 81–83: st/st.

Row 84: p, decreasing 1 st at each end of the row (19).

Work in st/st, decreasing 1 st at each end of every fourth row until 11 sts remain.

Next row: k2, k2tog, k3, k2tog, k2 (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

Rows 31–33: st/st.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Left ear

Cast on 8 sts with dark brown yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: k to last 2 sts, k2tog (7).

Row 3: p2tog, p to end (6).

Cast off.

### Right ear

Cast on 8 sts with dark brown yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: skpo, k to end (7).

Row 3: p to last 2 sts, p2tog (6).

Cast off.

### Tail

Cast on 3 sts with dark brown yarn and work an i-cord for 2cm ( $\frac{3}{4}$ in).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### To make up

Fold one hind leg in half vertically and work a gathering thread through the foot edge, pull tightly.

Sew the rest of the leg seam.

Sew the tummy flap to the cast-on edge. Pinch the rest of the cast-on edge together and sew together to create the bottom. Make up the second hind leg and the front legs as for the first hind leg. Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the trunk seam and attach the front of the tummy flaps to the trunk. Stuff the body, head, legs and trunk and close the tummy seam. Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the tusk seams, leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Attach the tusks. Attach the cast-off edge of each ear to the head. Using black DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot, and the trunk with backstitch. See the picture for guidance. Attach the tail.



# Cave people

## Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 4 sts with khaki yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (8).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (12).

Row 5: k for fold line.

Row 6: k.

Row 7: p.

Row 8: (k1, kf/b, k1) to end (16).

Rows 9–11: st/st.

Row 12: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Row 13: change to skin colour yarn and p.

Row 14: (k2, kf/b) to end (16).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with skin colour yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Beard (optional)

Cast on 6 sts with dark brown fine bouclé yarn or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn.

Row 1: k.

Row 2: skpo, k to end (5).

Row 3: skpo, k to end (4).

Row 4: (k2tog) twice (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## Rock for hammer top

Cast on 4 sts with grey yarn and st/st 4 rows, starting with a k row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Hammer handle

Cast on 2 sts with brown yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows.

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## To make up

Follow the instructions on pages 16–18 to sew up the body and head and flatten the base. Attach the arms. Using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn, embroider each eye with a French knot. Create a nose by backstitching on the same spot three times with skin colour yarn.

Attach the beard using dark brown bouclé yarn; alternatively, backstitch all over the chin until you achieve the desired volume.

With brown bouclé yarn, backstitch all over the head to create hair, until you reach the volume you want.

Fold the rock piece in half horizontally, enclosing one end of the handle, and secure the rock with a few stitches, using the brown yarn. Using the same yarn, embroider the middle of the rock, passing the yarn over to the other side, and repeat. Attach the hammer to a hand with skin colour yarn. Embroider the head of the hammer with two strands of brown DK (8-ply) yarn.

## Instructions

### Towers

#### Centre tower

Cast on 8 sts with grey yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (16).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (24).

Row 5: p.

Row 6: (k2, kf/b) to end (32).

Row 7: p.

Row 8: (k3, kf/b) to end (40).

Row 9: p.

Row 10: (k4, kf/b) to end (48).

Row 11: p.

Row 12: (k5, kf/b) to end (56).

Row 13: k for the edge.

Starting with a k row, st/st until the piece measures 9cm (3½in) from the edge. Finish with a p row.

\* Change to dark red yarn and st/st 8 rows, starting with a k row.

Next row: (k2, k2tog) to end (42).

Work 4 rows in st/st, starting with a p row.

Next row: (p1, p2tog) to end (28).

Work 2 more rows in st/st.

Next row: (k2tog) to end (14).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off. \*\*

#### The left front tower

Follow the instructions given for the centre tower to row 8.

Row 9: k for the edge.

Starting with a k row, st/st until the piece measures 8cm (3¼in) from the edge. Finish with a p row.

Work from \* to \*\* as given for the centre tower. The stitch count will be 30, 20, 10 sts respectively at the decrease rows.

#### The right front tower

Follow the instructions given for the centre tower to row 8.

Row 9: k for the edge.

Starting with a k row, st/st until the piece measures 8cm (3¼in) from the edge. Finish with a p row.

Continue as follows.

Row 1: (k3, k2tog) to end (32).

Row 2: p.

Row 3: (k2, k2tog) to end (24).

Row 4: p.

Row 5: (k1, k2tog) to end (16).

Row 6: p.

Row 7: (k2tog) to end (8).

Row 8: p.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Materials

#### Castle:

DK (8-ply) yarn:

60g (2oz), grey

DK (8-ply) yarn: 20g (¾oz), dark red

DK (8-ply) yarn: 5g (⅙oz), brown

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amount of white

#### Size

18cm (7in) tall,

16cm (6¼in) wide

#### Difficulty level

Intermediate

#### Rear towers: make two

Follow the instructions given for the centre tower to end of row 6.

Row 7: k for the edge.

Starting with a k row, st/st until the piece measures 13cm (5in) from the edge. Finish with a p row.

Work from \* to \*\* as given for the centre tower. The stitch count will be 24, 16, 8 sts respectively at the decrease rows.

## Battlements

The battlements for the towers start and finish with a short section, but do not worry. The seams go at the back of each tower, so they are hidden.

### For the centre tower

Cast on 65 sts with grey yarn and st/st 5 rows, starting with a p row.

Next row: k5, turn and work on this set of 5 sts.

Next row: k for fold line.

St/st 4 rows starting with a k row, cast off these 5 sts.

\* With the right side facing, rejoin grey yarn and knit the next 5 sts, turn. Work on this set of 5 sts.

St/st 4 rows, starting with a p row.

Next row: k for fold line.

St/st 6 rows, starting with a k row. Cast off these 5 sts.

\*\* With the right side facing, rejoin grey yarn and knit the next 5 sts, turn. Work on this set of 5 sts.

Next row: k for fold line.

St/st 4 rows, starting with a k row. Cast off these 5 sts.

Continue in the same way, alternating working from \* and from \*\* until all sts have been worked.

Sew the seams, folding at the fold lines.

### For the front towers: make two

Cast on 40 sts with grey yarn and follow the instructions given for the centre tower battlements.

### For the back towers: make two

Cast on 35 sts and follow the instructions given for the centre tower battlements.

### Gate door

Cast on 15 sts with brown yarn.

Rows 1–14: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 15: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (13).

Row 16: p.

Repeat rows 15 and 16 until there are 9 sts.

Cast off.

### Windows: make two

Cast on 10 sts with white yarn.

Rows 1–5: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 6: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (8).

Row 7: p.

Row 8: as row 6 (6).

Row 9: p2tog, cast off all the sts to the last 2 sts, p2tog and fasten off.

### Making up

Starting at the fasten-off end of each tower, sew the seam, stopping where the colour changes. Work a gathering thread along the cast-on edge of each tower and pull tightly. Sew the rest of the base and side seam leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. To flatten the base, insert a threaded needle through the centre of the base and bring it out at the side seam, about 4–5cm (1½–2in) from the base edge. Repeat. Attach a window to each front tower. Embroider the windowframes using brown DK (8-ply) yarn: create the outer frame using chain stitch, and the inside bars using long backstitches. Attach the gate door to the centre tower. Fold each battlement piece at the fold line and sew the seam. With the seam at the back and the cast-on edge at the bottom, attach a battlement around each tower where the colour changes, using

overcast stitch. Sew the towers together, or leave them unattached so that children can enjoy building.

## Soldier with chainmail

### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 4 sts with light grey yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (8).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (12).

Row 5: k for edge.

Row 6: p.

Row 7: (p1, pf/b, p1) to end (16).

Rows 8–11: st/st.

Row 12: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Change to skin colour yarn.

Row 13: p.

Row 14: (k2, kf/b) to end (16).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with light grey yarn and work an i-cord for 3 rows (see page 21). Change to skin colour yarn and work one more row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.



## Chainmail

Cast on 20 sts with dark grey yarn.  
Rows 1–3: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 4: p7, cast off next 6 sts, p to end (14).

Row 5: k7, turn. Work on this set of 7 sts.

Rows 6–9: st/st, starting with a p row.

Break off yarn, leaving sts on the needle.

With right side facing, rejoin dark grey yarn to the other set of 7 sts. Work on this set of 7 sts.

Rows 5–9: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 10: p across the row connecting both sets of sts (14).

Row 11: (k2tog) to end (7).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## To make up

Follow the instruction given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base. Attach the arms. Sew the chainmail seam and attach the chainmail to the head, with the seam at the back. Embroider each eye with a French knot, using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn.

Create a nose by backstitching on the same spot three times with skin colour yarn.



## Foot soldier with shield

### Body and head

Cast on 4 sts with light grey yarn and follow the instructions given for the soldier with chainmail to end of row 9. Work rows 10–12 with dark grey yarn and rows 13–20 with skin colour yarn.

### Cap

Cast on 17 sts with dark grey yarn.

Row 1: (k1 dark grey, k3 brown) to last st, k1 dark grey.

Row 2: keeping the colours correct, p.

Row 3: keeping the colours correct, (k2, k2tog) to last st, k1 (13).

Row 4: keeping the colours correct, (p1, p2tog) to last st, p1 (9).

Break yarn, draw through sts with dark grey yarn, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Arms: make two

Follow the instructions given for the soldier with chainmail, using dark grey yarn for the sleeve and skin colour for the hand.

### Shield

Cast on 16 sts with light grey DK (8-ply) yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: (k2tog, k2) to end (12).

Row 3: (p2tog) to end (6).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Beard

Cast on 6 sts with light brown fine bouclé yarn.

Row 1: k.

## Materials

### Soldier with chainmail:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of light grey, skin colour, dark grey and dark brown

Stuffing

### Foot soldier with shield:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of light grey, dark grey, skin colour, brown and dark brown

Fine bouclé yarn: small amount of light brown

Stuffing

## Size

5cm (2in) tall

## Difficulty level

Intermediate

Row 2: skpo, k to end (5).

Row 3: skpo, k to end (4).

Row 4: skpo, k to end (3).

Cast off.

## To make up

Follow the instructions given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base. Starting at the fasten-off end, sew the cap seam and attach the cap to the head. Attach the arms and the beard. Embroider each eye with a French knot, using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn. Create a nose by backstitching on the same spot three times, with skin colour yarn. Sew the shield seam and attach the shield to one arm.

# Soldier with armour, full face helmet

## Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 4 sts with off-white yarn. Follow the instructions given for the soldier with chainmail to row 12. Do not change colour, continue working with off-white yarn.

Row 13: p.

Row 14: (k1, kf/b) to end (18).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k1, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Grey visor

Cast on 2 sts with grey yarn.

Row 1: kf/b, k1 (3).

Row 2: pf/b, p1, pf/b (5).

Row 3: kf/b, k to last st, kf/b (7).

Row 4: pf/b, p to last st, pf/b (9).

Row 5: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (7).

Row 6: p2tog, p to last 2 sts, p2tog (5).

Row 7: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).

Cast off.

## Shield

Cast on 2 sts with white yarn.

Row 1: pf/b, p1 (3).

Row 2: kf/b, k1, kf/b (5).

Row 3: pf/b, p to last st, pf/b (7).

Join in red yarn.

Row 4: k3 white, k1 red, k3 white.

Row 5: keeping the colours correct, p.

Row 6: k2 white, k3 red, k2 white.

Row 7: p3 white, p1 red, p3 white.

Break off red and continue with white.

Row 8: k.

Row 9: p.

Row 10: p for fold line.

Row 11: p.

Rows 12–16: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 17: p2tog, p3, p2tog (5).

Row 18: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).

Row 19: p1, p2tog (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## Shoulder pieces: make two

Cast on 8 sts with off-white yarn and st/st 2 rows, starting with a p row.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with grey yarn and work an i-cord for 4 rows (see page 21). Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## To make up

Follow the instructions given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base. Attach the visor to the face.

Wrap a shoulder piece around the top of one arm and, starting at the fasten-off end of the shoulder seam, sew the seam. With the seam facing in towards the body, attach to the body. Repeat for the second arm and shoulder piece. With red DK (8-ply) yarn, backstitch a few times on the top of the head, leaving loops every other stitch. Cut the loops and separate the strands. Attach the shield to one of the arms.

### Soldier with armour, full face helmet:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of off-white, grey, white and red

Stuffing

### Soldier with armour, face showing:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of off-white, skin colour, grey, brown, dark brown and red




# Soldier with armour, face showing

## Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 4 sts with off-white yarn. Follow the instructions given for the soldier with chainmail, using off-white yarn for the body and skin colour yarn for the head.

## Helmet

Cast on 18 sts with off-white yarn. Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: (p1, p2tog) to end (12).

Row 6: (k2tog) to end (6).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Helmet visors: make two

Cast on 9 sts with grey yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (7).

Row 3: p2tog, p3, p2tog (5).

Row 4: skpo, k1, k2tog (3).

Row 5: sl1, p2tog (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## Arms, shoulder pieces: make two of each

As given for the soldier with armour, full face helmet.

## Battle axe

Cast on 7 sts with grey yarn.

St/st, starting with a k row and decreasing 1 st at each end of every row until there are 3 sts.

Continue in st/st, increasing 1 st at each end of every row until there are 7 sts. Cast off.

For the handle, cast on 2 sts with brown yarn and work an i-cord for 6cm (2½in).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## Lance

Cast on 8 sts with grey yarn and st/st 4 rows, starting with a k row.

Row 5: k, decreasing 1 st at each end of the row (6).

Rows 6–8: st/st.

Row 9: (k2tog) to end (3).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

For the handle, cast on 2 sts with grey yarn and work an i-cord for 6cm (2½in).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

## To make up

Follow the instructions given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base.

Attach the helmet and visors.

Embroider each eye with a French knot using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn. With skin colour yarn, create the nose by backstitching on the same spot three times.

Wrap a shoulder piece around the top of one arm and, starting at the fasten-off end of the shoulder seam, sew the seam. With the seam facing in towards the body, attach to the body. Repeat for the second arm and shoulder piece. With red DK (8-ply) yarn, backstitch a few times on the top of the head, leaving loops every other stitch. Cut the loops and separate the strands.

To make up the battle axe, wrap the axe around one end of the handle and sew the cast-on and cast-off edges together. Secure to the handle with a few stitches using grey yarn.

To make up the lance, wrap the lance around one end of the handle and sew the seam. Secure to the handle with a few stitches using grey yarn.

Attach the lance or battle axe to an arm.



## Materials

### Archer:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of blue, white, skin colour, brown, grey and dark brown

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of white

Fine bouclé yarn: small amount of red-brown for a beard (optional)

Stuffing

### Prisoner:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of black, white, skin colour, dark grey, khaki and dark brown

Fingering (4-ply) yarn: small amount of white

Fine bouclé yarn: small amount of dark brown

Stuffing

## Additional equipment

3mm (UK 11, US C/2 or D/3) crochet hook

## Size

5cm (2in) tall

## Difficulty level

Intermediate

## Archer

### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 4 sts with blue yarn. Follow the instructions given for the soldier with chainmail to row 7.

Join in white yarn.

Row 8: k7 blue, k1 white, k8 blue.

Row 9: keeping the colours correct, p.

Row 10: k6 blue, k3 white, k7 blue.

Row 11: p8 blue, p1 white, p7 blue.

Row 12: keeping the colours correct, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k5, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 (12).

Change to skin colour yarn.

Row 13: p.

Row 14: (k2, kf/b) to end (16).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Arms and shoulder pieces: make two of each

As given for the soldier with armour, full face helmet, using skin colour yarn for the arms and brown yarn for the shoulder pieces.

### Helmet

Follow the instructions given for the soldier with armour, face showing, using grey yarn.

## Bow

Cast on 2 sts with brown yarn and work an i-cord for 2cm ( $\frac{3}{4}$ in), as explained on page 21.

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

### Beard (optional)

Follow the instructions given for the foot soldier, using fine red-brown bouclé yarn.

### To make up

Follow the instructions given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base. Wrap a shoulder piece around the top of one arm and, starting at the fasten-off end of the shoulder seam, sew the seam. With the seam facing in towards the body, attach to the body. Repeat for the second arm and shoulder piece. Seam and attach the helmet and attach the beard. Embroider each eye with a French knot using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn (see page 22). To create the nose, backstitch on the same spot three times with skin colour yarn. Shape the bow, and attach a length of white fingering (4-ply) yarn to both ends. Attach the bow to one hand.





## Prisoner

### Body and head

Follow the instructions given for the soldier with chainmail, using black yarn for the body, white yarn for row 8 and row 10 and skin colour for the head.

### Ball and chain

Cast on 8 sts with dark grey yarn.

Row 1: kf/b in each st (16).

Rows 2–6: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 7: (k2tog) to end (8).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

With white fingering (4-ply) yarn and a crochet hook, make a chain measuring 15cm (5¾in) long. Fasten off.

### Arms: make two

Cast on 2 sts with skin colour yarn and work an i-cord for 4 rows. Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Hat

Cast on 18 sts with khaki yarn.

Rows 1–4: st/st, starting with a p row.

Row 5: (p1, p2tog) to end (12).

Rows 6–7: st/st.

Row 8: (k2tog) to end (6).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.


### Beard

Follow the instructions given for the foot soldier, using dark brown fine bouclé yarn.

### To make up

Follow the instruction given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base. Attach the arms. Sew the hat seam and attach to the head. Attach the beard. Embroider each eye with a short backstitch using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn. To create the nose, backstitch on the same spot three times with skin colour yarn.

To make up the ball, starting at the fasten-off end, sew the seam leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff and close the seam. Attach the ball to the chain. Wrap the chain around the body and secure with a few small stitches.



# Snow White and the seven dwarves

## Instructions

### Snow White

#### Body and head

Cast on 8 sts with yellow yarn.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (16).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (24).

Row 5: k for edge.

Rows 6–13: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 14: (k2, k2tog) to end (18).

Change to blue yarn.

Rows 15–18: st/st.

Join in skin colour yarn.

Row 19: p7 blue, p4 skin colour, p7 blue.

Row 20: (k1 blue, k2tog blue) twice, k1 blue, (k1, k2tog, k1) skin colour, (k1, k2tog blue) twice, k1 blue (13).

Break off blue yarn and change to skin colour yarn.

Row 21: p.

Row 22: k4, (kf/b) five times, k4 (18).

Rows 23–25: st/st.

Row 26: k3, (k2tog, k1) four times, k3 (14).

Rows 27–29: st/st.

Row 30: k2 (k2tog, k2) to end (11).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Sleeves: make two

Cast on 8 sts with light blue yarn.

Row 1: (p1 red, p1 light blue) to end.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### Arms: make two

Cast on 3 sts with skin colour yarn and work an i-cord for 4 rows.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

#### To make up

See pages 16–19.

#### Materials

##### Snow White:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of yellow, blue, skin colour, light blue, red and dark brown

Fine fingering (2-ply) yarn: small amount of dark brown, or two strands taken from dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn

Stuffing

##### Size

8cm (3¼in) tall

##### Difficulty level

Intermediate







## Dwarves: make seven in different colours

### Body and head

Starting with the base, cast on 4 sts with yarn in the colour of your choice, for the body.

Row 1: p.

Row 2: kf/b in each st (8).

Row 3: p.

Row 4: (k1, kf/b) to end (12).

Row 5: k for the edge.

Row 6: k.

Row 7: (p1, pf/b, p1) to end (16).

Rows 8–11: st/st.

Row 12: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Change to skin colour yarn.

Row 13: p.

Row 14: (k2, kf/b) to end (16).

Rows 15–19: st/st.

Row 20: (k2, k2tog) to end (12).

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

### Beard

Cast on 6 sts with bouclé yarn or chunky fleecy yarn in the colour of your choice.

Rows 1–2: k.

Row 3: skpo, k2, k2tog (4).

Row 4: (k2tog) twice (2).

Pass the first stitch over the second stitch and fasten off.

### Hat

Cast on 16 sts with yarn in the colour of your choice.

Rows 1–8: st/st, starting with a k row.

Row 9: k1, (k2tog, k1) to end (11).

Row 10: p.

Break yarn, draw through sts, pull tightly and fasten off.

## Materials

### Seven dwarves:

DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of skin colour, dark brown and any colours of your choice

Bouclé yarn or chunky fleecy yarn: small amounts of colour of your choice for the beard

Stuffing

### Size

4cm (1½in) tall

### Difficulty level

Intermediate

## To make up

Follow the instructions given on pages 16–18 to make up the body and head and flatten the base.

Sew the hat seam and attach it to the head. Attach the beard.

To create the nose, backstitch on the same spot three times with skin colour yarn. Embroider each eye with a French knot, using dark brown DK (8-ply) yarn.





## Materials

### Cottage:

- DK (8-ply) yarn: 20g (¾oz), light brown
- DK (8-ply) yarn: 10g (⅓oz) brown and white mix
- DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of brown and white
- DK (8-ply) yarn: small amounts of red, pink, yellow and green for embroidering flowers
- Chunky yarn: 10g (⅓oz), red or red DK (8-ply) yarn knitted double
- Stuffing

### Additional equipment

- A pair of 4mm (UK 8, US 6) knitting needles

### Size

- 11cm (4¼in) wide, 5cm (2in) deep, 15cm (5¾in) high

### Difficulty level

- Intermediate

## Cottage

### Front and back panels: make one of each

Cast on 28 sts with light brown yarn and k 4 rows.  
 St/st, starting with k row for 5cm (2in), ending with a p row.  
 Next row: k1, skpo, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1 (26).  
 Next row: p.  
 Repeat last 2 rows until 4 sts remain.  
 Next row: skpo, k2tog (2).  
 Pass the first st over the second st and fasten off.

### Side panels: make two

Cast on 14 sts with light brown yarn and k 4 rows.  
 St/st, starting with a k row for 5cm (2in), ending with a p row.  
 Cast off.

### Decoration

Cast on 6 sts with brown and white mix yarn.  
 Rows 1–3: st/st, starting with a k row.  
 Row 4: k.  
 Repeat rows 1–4 until the piece measures about 30cm (11¼in).  
 Cast off.

### Door

Cast on 10 sts with brown yarn.  
 Rows 1–10: st/st, starting with a k row.  
 Row 11: skpo, k to last 2 sts, k2tog (8).  
 Row 12: p.  
 Rows 13–16: repeat rows 11–12 twice more (4).  
 Row 17: k1, k2tog, k1 (3).  
 Cast off.

### Base

Cast on 28 sts with light brown yarn and st/st 21 rows, starting with a k row. Cast off.

### Windows: make three


Cast on 10 sts with white yarn and st/st 9 rows, starting with a k row. Cast off.

### Roof

Cast on 12 sts with chunky red yarn or red DK (8-ply) yarn knitted double and 4mm (UK 8, US 6) knitting needles. Work in g-st for 19cm (7½in). Cast off.

### To make up

Attach one window and the door to the front panel. Attach two windows to the back panel. Embroider the windows as shown in the diagram, using DK (8-ply) yarn in different colours. Embroider a door knob using green DK (8-ply) yarn. Sew the front, back and side panels together and stuff. Attach the base and the roof. Attach the decoration and embroider, using the diagrams of the window and flowers given below as guidance.























